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## CharacterPlus® Celebrates 2025 State Schools of Character

CharacterPlus®, the longest-running character education initiative in the country, is proud to announce the area's 16 schools named 2025 Missouri Schools of Character. These schools have demonstrated a focus on character development which has positively impacted academic achievement, student behavior, and school climate. In the 2025 nationwide evaluation process, conducted by Character.org, 98 schools have been named State Schools of Character, and 5 districts have been named State Districts of Character. Additionally, eight international schools have been named Schools of Character.

CharacterPlus is the Missouri affiliate for the State Schools of Character process and evaluates all Missouri schools and districts that apply. This recognition is given to schools and districts that have achieved a standard of excellence in the area of character development through their exemplary implementation of Character.org's 11 Principles of Effective Character Education, a framework for whole-school improvement.

If a school is designated a National School of Character, they also hold that designation for five years. National Schools of Character are announced annually in May.
